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GENERAL INFORMATION

CAMPING GROUNDS

A public camping ground has been opened close to Glen More Lodge, occupying a pleasant open site between Loch Morlich and the lower slopes of the Cairn Gorm. The facilities include water supply, lavatories, and a room for shelter and recreation in wet weather. The charges are:

At Glen More the "Norwegian" huts are reserved for Youth Organisations. These huts consist of one building, comprising two large huts with a communicating apartment. One hut is partitioned into four rooms, used as sleeping quarters. There are no bunks in the sleeping quarters. The other hut is divided into three—cook-house, office or store, and dining-room-cum-common-room. The communicating apartment contains sprays, washhand basins and lavatories. When parties are to include members of both sexes, this must be stated at the time of application for use of the huts. Use of the huts by mixed parties will be authorised by the Director of Forestry for Scotland if he is satisfied that there will be adequate adult supervision. The huts are fitted with self-contained lavatories

and hot water system, but fuel, cooking utensils, beds and bedding are not provided. About 40 can be accommodated in the huts.

The following is the scale of charges:

Applications for the period from 1st October till 28th April are not accepted before 1st September. Applications for the period from 28th April till 30th September are not accepted before 1st March.

The above does not apply to week-end bookings, which will be considered four weeks in advance of the week-end wanted. The duration of a week-end is from Saturday mid-day to Monday mid-day. All bookings commence and end at mid-day on Saturdays.

PARKING GROUNDS

There are two car parks. One is at the eastern end of Loch Morlich, an excellent spot for a picnic. The other is at the foot of the main Cairn Gorm hill path, a mile further on, and is reached by bearing right at both of two road forks. The charges are:

GLEN MORE LODGE

Glen More Lodge is now a residential centre for education and recreation out of doors, rented from the Forestry Commission by the Scottish Education Department, and administered by the Scottish Council of Physical Recreation. Organised courses are run throughout the year. There are three types: for students of training colleges, for school pupils, and holiday training courses open to the general public.

At Christmas and Easter the emphasis is on winter sports; in the summer the programme includes high and low level tramping, route-finding, field studies, climbing, camping, sailing and canoeing on Loch Morlich, photography and weather lore. All enquiries concerning courses should be directed to:
